On October 24, 25, and 26, 1976, THE INTERNATIONAL CENTER FOR THE HUMAN ENVIRONMENT (TICHE) will host HABITAT 2 in San Francisco.

As an international conference for the United States in implementing the recommendations of the United Nations Conference on Human Settlements, HABITAT 2 will focus on Institutions and Management, Shelter and Infrastructure, and Environmental Impact Analysis, in the framework of national action.

Invited leaders from industry, finance, government agencies, educational environmental organizations will meet for three (3) days in intensive workshops and seminars at the University of San Francisco.

The first day of the conference will explore future visions of human environments to determine a base of mutual concern.

On the second day, the participants will discuss alternative means of achieving shared goals.

On the third day, the position paper of the conference with commitments for future action and joint activity will be prepared and delivered to all participants.

It is envisioned that the document emerging from HABITAT 2 will be presented to government, industry, and public interest groups.

Conference participation will be limited to 100 individuals representing major decision making forces.

As decisions made by leaders in the United States can affect developments and policy decisions throughout the world, keynote speakers will include internationally prominent experts on select aspects of human environments.

Consideration is now in progress concerning television broadcast of the HABITAT 2 proceedings, provision of space for exhibitors, and the establishment of telecommunication links with other HABITAT implementation conferences.
